**NEW FOREST STATION
TO BRING TIMBER NEED
TO STATE'S ATTENTION**

Headquarters of the old Mississippian Valley Forest Experiment Station will be located at Columbus, Ohio, in the fall, according to a statement made by Secretary of Agriculture Herbert C. Hoover after a careful study of representations of the department of natural resources of the state of Illinois. The new experiment station will be located in the state of Illinois, with its service and will be affiliated with the Ohio State University and the University of Illinois, both of which are at Columbus. The Ohio-Mississippi Valley region which it is to be expected will include the states of Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Missouri, western Kentucky, and southern Arkansas.

Hoover said that the new station is now engaged in a study of the timber resources of the state of Ohio. The initial expenditure of \$30,000 for the Ohio station will be followed by an additional sum each year. It will not be until a technical staff of from 15 to 20 men is available that work will be started on the initiation and operation of the new experiment station.

The first of the forest experiments is to furnish the technical knowledge and experience of the use of timber crops and to parallel for future growing on our \$100,000,000 worth of timber land in Illinois which has been so admirably performed by the agricultural experiment stations of the state of Illinois.

Systematizing the organization and work of the forest experiment stations, the committee has divided the state into eleven principal forest regions, each of which is to be under the charge of a very limited liaison, have now been established.
