They levy at least the maximum fine for educational purposes, which is \$15. (The fine valuation), they may make an additional claim as follows:

Multiplying \$25 by the number of pupils in average daily attendance.

Minimally \$500 by the number of pupils in average daily attendance.

In the greater of these two amounts, the maximum of \$25 per full valuation, the excess may be claimed

as a special assessment.

The Law Goes Into Effect.

The bill as passed, and approved by the legislative committee, provides that the following requirements are required for the collection and mailing of the money:

1. Minimally \$500 by the number of pupils in average daily attendance.

2. The greater of these two amounts, the maximum of \$25 per full valuation, the excess may be claimed

Mrs. William T. Edwards, who has been several weeks with Mrs. Johnson, has returned to Wauconda.


