## MOTHER'S DAY

Next Sunday will be observed as Mother's Day. Mother's Day had its origin in a thought by a Philadelphia young woman, Miss Anna M. J. Williams, whose suggestion it was to observe in a number of cities in the United States in 1910.

The beautiful idea spread rapidly until it was commenced in 1913 by a joint resolution of Congress whereby that body and the executive departments of the government recognized it. On May 14, 1914, a formal recognition was given by Congress, when the President was authorized to designate by annual proclamation the second Sunday in May as Mother's Day, and to request the display of the American flag on government buildings and private homes.

The first proclamation under this authority was issued by President Woodrow Wilson in May, 1914, and the custom has been continued ever since.

The object of the day is to recall the memories of mothers who have given the world to you, and to pay tributes of affection to the living.

The badge for the day is the white carnation, emblematic of the beauty, purity and fidelity of mother love. By the way, the red carnation is worn in honor of living mothers.

For us reflect as often as we should upon the debt of love and gratitude we owe to our mothers. By thoughts and acts of sincere affection on Mother's Day, and on other days, we not only honor them, but also honor ourselves.

## RELIGION TACKLES A BIG JOB

Those who feel that the promotion of international peace is a process of education rather than a task for legislation and diplomacy read with interest recently that the Church Peace Union has invited Dr. Doerf Henry A. Atkinson, to discuss with the leaders of the great world religions how the followers of these beliefs can best organize their efforts against war. The Church Peace Union, which is one of the Carnegie Foundations for the promotion of world peace, has a membership of 1,000,000, the persons of all faiths, from the most learned to the most ignorant, who will have been appointed to the conference.

Before sailing, Doctor Atkinson

announced that officers and committees have been appointed in almost all the great countries of the world to organize "The World Conference for International Peace Through Religion" which will be held probably during the summer of 1930.

The character of this movement is indicated by the fact that among the six presidents appointed to represent the leading religious beliefs are Doctor S. Parkes, of America; Dr. T. H. H. T. of Japan; Dr. Fausto, Basilean, a member of the Japanese House of Peers and formerly mayor of Tokyo, and the great Indian philosopher, Doctor Rabindranath Tagore. Leaders of twenty different sects, including Christians, Jews, Mohammedans and all the great religions of the East, have subscribed to the conference plan.

Plans are now being made, according to Doctor Atkinson, to collect a fund in America to finance the conference and make it possible for the delegates chosen by the various religious bodies to travel the great distances which they will have to cover in attending the conference. Although the location of the meeting has not been decided, Geneva, Switzerland, is said to be the place favored by a majority of those interested.

## DRIVER'S LICENSE LAWES LOWER ACCIDENTS

The chief motor vehicle inspector of Pennsylvania recently said that the most successful deterrent to having against automobile recklessness is the driver's license law.

In Pennsylvania when a driver's license is revoked, he may appeal. Last year, driving privileges were withdrawn from 869 persons. Yet, so overwhelming was the evidence against them, that there was not a single appeal.

Forbidding these recklessness, in

competent or otherwise dangerous drivers, the use of the public highways undoubtedly saved a great waste in lives and property in Pennsylvania.

An automobile is a potentially deadly vehicle. To allow it to be operated by a person who has not proven his ability and competence is inexcusable. And the trend in motor laws at present in all states, is to have a severe examination of persons applying for licenses.

So far, 17 states have passed such laws. Applications for licenses have resulted in instance. Examination of drivers and revocation of license for cause, will not entirely do away withreckless and incompetent driving, but it should materially lower the gigantic annual toll of death and injuries.

## RIN TIN TIN

A new talkie in which the famous actor, Rin Tin Tin appears as a star performer has been facetiously called a "barkie" by a New York critic.

Rin Tin Tin is a truly remarkable animal, as all who have seen him on the screen will admit. He is a pureblooded Belgian police dog, one of a litter of puppies found by American soldiers in a captured German sector during the World War, and adopted by Lee Duncan, an aviation corps, who brought him to the United States and trained him for the movies.

The dog has figured prominently in fifteen pictures. One of his most impressive stunts is to apprehend the villain of the play and thwart his malevolent designs by springing at his throat with apparent ferocity.

It is related that he is even oblivious to villains in real life, as evidenced by the fact that some time ago a burglar robust his master's home while Rin Tin Tin slept peacefully in a nearby few feet away.

## A DUBIOUS SUPPOSITION

Advocates of the proposed law to forbid interstate shipment of small arms are basing their case on a very dubious supposition—that once law is passed, enforcement immediately follows.

It is to be hoped that the law would turn up itself and become a menace. The law-abiding citizen would no longer be able to buy a gun while one ship could smuggle in enough revolvers and pistols to supply all the criminals in the United States.

The American underworld is wonderfully organized. Its connections are far-reaching. No law could disarm its members.

To make it a felony for a person with a criminal record to possess a revolver or pistol, would not only penalize the person, but would not do far more to discourage the use of weapons by criminals than any legislation designed to prevent sale or shipment.

## A BLOODLESS WAR

War has broken out between Russia and Rumania, according to a cable dispatch, but it is a bloodless war, confined so far to radio attacks and counter attacks, such as we are becoming accustomed to in this war.

It is reported that the Rumanians have been employing their broadcasting station in Odessa for the purpose of disseminating Soviet propaganda inimical to Rumanian interests. Rumania has established a station at Chisinau for the purpose of countering the Rumanian radio broadcasts.

In order to make its offensive more effective, the Rumanians are using the same war-lease as the Russians, so it is likely that neither will be heard to any great extent.

Russia, however, is evidently going to turn out both stations when the interference makes them unintelligible, so that the war of propaganda will probably end in a draw.

## TO FLY THE PACIFIC

Next Fall it is planned to span by air-plane the world's greatest expanse of water from east to west, the Pacific ocean. At City Island, N. Y., a giant seaplane designed to make the trans-Pacific trip is being constructed.

According to the announcement, the new plane will have a wing spread of 150 feet, a top speed of 120 miles per hour, and carry a payload of eight tons.

In the light of the rapid advance in airplane engineering which have taken place recently there is no reason to doubt that the plan may be successfully carried out.
