INDEPENDENT DEALERS MAKE BEST SHOWING IN TOWNS UNDER 50,000

In many respects, the merchant in the small towns of the West is doing better than those in the larger cities, according to Prof. Paul D. Converse of the University of Illinois College of Commerce. Prof. Converse is engaged in making a study of ten retail trades in towns of various sizes for the Merchantil Affairs Committee of the Illinois Chamber of Commerce.

The study considers those towns of under 400 population; 400 to 1,000; 1,500 to 5,000; 7,000 to 15,000; and cities over 35,000, for a four-year period from July, 1925 to July 1929.

During this four year period the number of retailers in these 10 trades declined 3 per cent in towns under 400 population; 3 per cent in communities of 400 to 1,000; 0.6 per cent in towns of 1,500 to 5,000, and 4 per cent in cities of 7,000 to 15,000.

The figures cover independent merchants, but not the large chains. The decrease in the number of independent dealers may be due to the growth of chain stores. Prof. Converse said.

Towns of 400 to 1,000 made a better showing than the larger towns, and also better than many of the larger communities.

The hardware stores in these towns made a better showing than those in any other town group, except, perhaps, the group of cities of over 5,000 population.

The furniture and drug stores in these towns also made relatively good showings.

Towns of between 1,500 and 5,000 population in many ways made a better showing than any other group. The number of retail dealers there decreased only 0.5 per cent during the four years.

The percentage of dealers quitting business was also smaller than any other group of towns. The figure of 6.5 per cent arrived at after counting new dealers who started business during the period. Prof. Converse explained, adding that it seems safe to conclude that independent dealers in towns of under 5,000 have made a better showing than those in the larger cities of Illinois.

NAMES OF TOWNS

If an "ask me anything" question were to ask you what is the most popular name for towns in the United States, what would you guess? Unless you had checked up the names in the United States Postal Guide, it is safe to say that you would not hit upon the most popular name.

Of course, Washington would suggest itself, also Springfield, possibly Paris. But neither of these is the leader, although Washington stands in the second rank.

The most popular name in the United States is Clinton.

Next comes Chester, Florence, and Washington with 23 of each; Clayton, Madison, Marion and Troy, 27; Glenwood, Kingsbury, Newport, and Salem, 26; Ashland and Centerville, 22.

There are 24 Clevelands and the same number of Springfields, several of them being important cities. Other names range from this number downward. There is only one New York, but 2 Chicago, 6 Philadelphia, and 8 Detroit. Barrington occurs but twice.

JUST THE SAME OLD WORLD

Every now and then somebody starts a rumor that the world is becoming warmer or colder—every year, and eventually we shall either be burned to a crisp or frozen to death. People who harken to these words of doom will be encouraged by the statement of Dr. C. F. Marvin, chief of the Federal weather bureau, that the world's climate has not changed in the last two centuries. Diversities the vagaries that sometime seize Mother Earth, in the long run, "the weather straighten out the kinks," Dr. Marvin assures us.

As a matter of fact, the world's climate may have remained unchanged for some scores of centuries. There simply isn't any way of knowing. The thermometer is only about 200 years old, and records dating back as far as the 18th century yield very little information. Scattered bits of evidence, such as river stages, floods, heavy freezes, crop failures, famines and other episodes that flavor history are more picturesque than practical in throwing light on the subject.

However, average consistency over a period of time does not necessarily indicate consistency from year to year. For instance, the records show a series of rainfalls over a period of years followed by a series in which rainfall was below normal. Winter before last was the coldest known to modern Europe; and the weather bureau now announces that the past July was the hottest month in our weather history. And this is one time we'll believe the bureau.

POSTAGE STAMPS MAKE HISTORY

If you want to see a colorful pattern of American history without wandering through historical museums, gather together all the postage stamps issued by the post office department in commemoration of outstanding national events. From the landing of Columbus to the Lindbergh flight, these stamp tell in chronological order our development from an unexplored tract of land to our modern industrial civilization.

It is impossible to list the variety and range of historical subjects to whom importance the post office department has paid tribute. They include such events as the Louisiana purchase, the founding of Jamestown, the Revolution, the discovery and navigation of the Hudson river, the opening of the Panama canal and the close of the World war. The figures of Pere Marquette, Molly Pitcher, Robert Livingston, George Rogers Clark, Thomas Edison and Colonel Lindbergh are just some of those in the pictorial array.

At present the stamps are issued as soon as possible after the occurrence of the event to be commemorated, but this is by no means true in the past. Columbus' discovery was embodied in a postage stamp design in 1893, and the Jamestown series were issued in 1907. That we are still closing gaps in our historical stamp collection is shown by a recent issue commemorating the first arrival of immigrants to the United States from Norway in 1795.

RUNNING UP OUR FORESTS

Extinguishing a cigarette is far more simple than cutting down a forest, but to make smokers realize this fact is a problem that has long been faced by the United States forest service. "Smack fire" during 1929 burned over 807,000 acres of woodland, cigarettes being the largest single source of forest fire destruction.

Schemes for combating this fire menace have taxed the ingenuity of federal officials. It has been suggested that cigarette companies place a slip with a printed warning in the top of each package of cigarettes. Another proposal has been to treat the tobacco in the stub with a liquid that will prevent burning, but the problem there is to find a liquid not unpleasant to the taste when in contact with the fire.

The most recently developed method provides for a tip on the cigarette which causes the fire to go out when the stub is discarded.

PERIOD CONTRACT MADE FOR NATURAL GAS LINE FROM TEXAS TO CHICAGO

Chicago—First contracts for the construction of a natural gas line from the natural gas pipe line, which will serve the Chicago area, have been made to Northern Illinois Gas, to be built by the Continental Construction Company, which has been organized here, which costs about \$100,000,000, came from Iowa, according to the company's spokesman. It will take a little south of Chicago.

Right-of-way along the highway, which has been obtained, would property has been obtained, would be required. The pipe line will be buried five feet below the surface, and will be held in the cultivation ditch so that it will not be disturbed by the plowing of the soil. Texas Reliance belonging to the Texas Reliance Gas Company, which gives preference in the hauling of construction material, has agreed to will not interfere with the work in the line. According to the company, the line will be built in the shortest possible time.

Continental Construction Company, a Delaware corporation, with headquarters in New York, was formed by Citic Service Company; Frank, a director of the company, and a number of petroleum companies, to construct the line. The two companies have, in Texas, Oklahoma and Kansas, a supply of natural gas available to the amount of 1,000,000,000 cubic feet. It has a supply of 1,000,000,000 cubic feet and communities on route, the spokesman said.
