The Methodist church leads the preference of 1100 students as expressed by 1923. The Presbyterian faith comes second with 1155; the Catholics with 1037; Jews, 890; Christians, 460; Lutheran, 444; Baptist, 415; Congregational, 385; Episcopal, 290; Christian Science, 187; and Evangelical, 130.
