Elgin Takes Close Game From Bronchs in District Tourney

A highly-touted Elgin high basketball team had to turn on all its power to defeat the Barrington Bronchos in the district tournament held at Crystal Lake last week. Elgin triumphed by the slim margin of 29 to 26 after the Bronchs had led most of the way and momentum on the verge of creating a major upset. The local high school quintet led by Conn and Etters fought the big Elgin team on even terms all through the game and with a little more luck on shots would have turned the trick. This was the final contest of the year for the maroon and white team, and five seniors, Ullrich, Brandt, Capilli, Rowland, and Melners were in suit for the last time as Broncho cagers.

Dundee won the touring championship by beating Huntley 37 to 34 in the final game Saturday night. Huntley had reached the finals by turning in the big upset of the week-end—a 25 to 24 victory over Elgin in the semi-final. Led by "Ripster" Anderson, a slim sharpshooter forward, the Huntley aggregation was the surprise of the tournament and almost tripped Dundee in the title game. Palatine and Arlington of the Northwest conference put up good battles before being eliminated in the second round. Palatine lost to Huntley, 31 to 28; and Heights fell before Dundee, 36 to 27.

The Libertyville Wildcats turned in the best performance of the conference schools by taking second in the Libertyville district meet. The Wildcats knocked off Waukegan 33 to 28 and Deerfield-Shields, 23 to 18 and only lost 29 to 32 to Maine (Des Plaines) in the championship game. The 16 sectional winners all over the state, go to Champaign next week to decide the 1934 state championship.
