We have a hunch that a lot of business firms are declining to pay assessments against them for maintenance of the NRA on grounds that the blue eagle hinders them rather than benefits them and was forced upon them uninvited. The NRA is receiving some downright refusals to pay for administration costs, but in the majority of cases, dissenters will just sit tight, pay nothing and say nothing. Charles M. Levy & Sons, precious jewelry producing company of New York notified the administration in no uncertain terms that it would not pay its assessment. The letter to the administration to this effect stated:

"Gentlemen: We are in receipt this morning of an invoice for \$100 for a contribution to maintain the code authority in the jewelry industry.
