Only One City in World Bears Name "Ann Arbor"

The name Ann Arbor is distinctive to this city alone. Nowhere in the world is there another Ann Arbor, says a United Press writer.

No food or merchandise bears this name as a trademark. Ann Arbor is original. Mail comes from even official Washington addressed to "Ann Arbor," but still Ann Arbor gets its mail.

Postal guides list only one Ann Arbor. Gazetteers, encyclopedias, atlas tables, dictionaries and maps refer to the postal information, substantiate the postal information, and research workers who explore unknown territories never have established another Ann Arbor as far as can be determined.

There are eight Detroit, eleven Diamonds, seven Cubas, a dozen Boston, twenty-two Buffalo, twenty-five Cleveland and other names in like number. But Ann Arbor, like San Francisco and New York, is one of a few cities not duplicated. Even New York is duplicated in New York Mills. This name appears in the postal lists for New York and Minnesota.

Gallion, Ohio, has the distinction of bearing a name not borne by any other place in the world. It was laid out in 1831 by two German brothers, Jacob and Michael Ruhl, and settled mostly by German people, who petitioned their government to name their postoffice Goshen. But finding that there were several other Goshens, the official suggested altering it to Gallion, which was later changed to Gallion.

"Cables," Money Market Term Used by Exchanges

The term "cables" is a money market term for cable orders, and is used by exchanges and money market report term under which the rates of exchange for such orders or transfers are quoted. According to "Euler's Foreign Exchange Exchange," the prices of sight draft and long bills are based on the price of cables.

The first thing in the morning the foreign exchange banker, say in New York, receives a telegram from his correspondent in London, telling him just what the rate on New York is over there. With this information on hand, he is in a position to commence buying and selling. The rate for cables having been established, it is easy enough to fix the price of demand drafts, the latter being cheaper by an amount corresponding to 10 days' interest.

When a banker sells a cable he makes immediate payment out of his balance sheet. When, however, he sells a sight draft, his balance abroad remains undisturbed for eight or nine or ten days, which is the quickest time in which the draft he has sold can be presented for encashment. Naturally he will charge less than when he sells a cable and loses the use of his money at once.

Siamese Woodpecker Parasites The Siamese rufous woodpecker has a decidedly easy attitude at the expense of an industrious species of ant that lives in the thick jungles of its native country.

According to a Washington ornithologist, who has studied the bird life of Siam, Indo-China and other little known lands of southeastern Asia, the ants, says the Detroit News, make large lumpy nests high among the branches of the jungle trees, presumably out of wood pulp chewed up in their jaws. When nesting comes for the woodpeckers, which at other times of the year inhabit the giant bamboo thickets, these birds repair to the jungle haunts of the ants and bore holes into the latter's paper maché nests to make homes for their young. As the ants are so busy to injure, the woodpeckers not only sponge on the ants for homes but feed their offspring on their host and their larvae.
