The Barrington high school Bronchos will enter the district tournament at Crystal Lake again this year according to announcement received from the state office of the Illinois High School Athletic association.

The same 14 high school basketball teams, representing six different conferences of northeastern Illinois, that played in the tournament last year have been assigned to play again. The tourney will be staged on March 6, 7, 8 and 9. A study of the records this season shows most of the entrants doing well in their respective circuits.

The total number of entries this year in Illinois is 852, just one less than last year. Nearby tournament district centers are Rockford, Aurora, DeKalb and Libertyville. There are 64 centers in the state among which Crystal Lake ranked seventh last year in total number of admissions.
