





Bronchos Fifth

Russ Overdue of BHS Comes Through With Surprise Win in Mile

Barrington high's surprising track team, which finished fifth in the Palatine Relays Saturday, will endeavor to stir up some more excitement when they compete in the annual Lake county meet at Waukegan next Tuesday. The field for the county championship is expected to be better than in past years. Libertyville, and Waukegan with the first named having the edge.

Arlington Heights' speedy team with 40 points, won the Palatine Relays Saturday from a field of 10 schools, but the big surprise came when the Barrington Bronchos finished fifth with 16 1/2 points, ahead of such schools as Naperville, Geneva and Crystal Lake. Libertyville, with 24 points and Palatine third with 23, Wopstock finishing just ahead of the Bronchos.

Overdue Wins

Russ Overdue of Barrington supplied the unexpected when he came through with an easy win in the mile with a time of 5:09.3. Overdue, who is a senior, was only running his second competitive race, but performed like a veteran to finish far ahead of his nearest rival. Ray Oebler, the Bronchos star middle-distance runner, also turned in a fine performance. He tied for first with Robbing of Heights in the 440 in 54 seconds flat—4 of a second under the present conference record, and then finished second to Robbing in the 880 which was also run under the conference standard. Other local points were contributed by Notz, fourth in the 800 and Mair fifth in the shot put.

Hahnfeldt Stars

Eddie Hahnfeldt, Palatine's one-man team, was the outstanding individual of the meet. He was in superb form, hurling the discus 145 feet 6 inches to exceed the state mark of 129 feet 10 inches and then threw the javelin 146 feet 10 inches as compared to the state mark of 180 feet 2 inches. Hahnfeldt is considered one of the most outstanding track stars to ever appear in the conference, if not in the entire state. The Bronchos expect Palatine in a dual meet at Palatine this afternoon with the Pirates slight favorites to win.

Bears to Battle Red-Wings Sunday in Season Opener

Arlington Heights Scene of Initial Game; Play Here Next Week

With most of the veterans back at their old posts and several newcomers fighting to break into the lineup, the Barrington Bears, strong local baseball club, will make its first contest of the 1935 season Sunday afternoon, battling the Arlington Red-Wings at Heights.

The Bears expect to be better than ever this season especially since several promising recruits are available. They are Al Hittman, a pitcher from Iowa State; Art Workman, P.H.S. catcher last season; and Bob Young, infielder from North Central, leading his team in the Little Nineteen last year.

The local club's first home game is scheduled for May 12, the following Sunday, with the Libertyville Young Men's club as opponents.
