Village Settles Gjeltefeld Sewer Claim for \$4000

A year old Account Satisfied at 25 Cents on the Dollar

The settlement was made last night by the village and the Gjeltefeld Sewer Company, represented by H. K. Cavender, as the result of a long and bitter fight for having installed in the North Street sewer in the North Street village.

The sewer was installed as a result of a link between the village and the village of North Street, E. J. & E. crossing sewer as an outlet for the sewer to the northwest part of the village.
