

Wauconda Teams Easy Victims of Bronks, Ponies

Bronks Win 41-18; Ponies Cop 22-8; Both Play at Elm, Friday

The Bronchos completely outclassed a midget Wauconda team in a basketball game on the home court, Tuesday evening, the local high school bearyweight triumphing, 41 to 18, for their seventh Northwest conference victory of the season.

Norris Grabenkort, bespectacled forward and one of the leading conference scorers, guided the Bronk attack with six baskets and a free throw.

Reserves Star Two reserves, Stout and Niemeler, also helped set the Bronk total—Stout making nine points, and Niemeler, seven. Diane featured for Wauconda with four baskets and three charity tosses.

The Barrington Ponies also had an easy time, defeating the Wauconda lightweight, 22 to 8. Ed. Gaar led the scoring with five baskets while "Butch" Bierman contributed three from the field.

Bronchos and Ponies travel to Lake Zurich, Friday night, for games with the Elm high school teams. Elm has exceptionally good teams this year and may give the locals some trouble.

Snow-bound roads that prevented their opponents from getting full teams together, caused the postponement of the Warren games last Friday. The games will be played at some future date.
