

Financial Drive for Boy Scouts Starting Friday

Dinner at Greenwood Grill to Begin Groundwork for Annual Budget

The Executive Drive for the boy scout and girl scout groups in the village of Barrington will get underway this morning at the breakfast night at Greenwood Grill with A. J. Winchell, finance chairman, speaking to a group of captains to conduct the campaign.

John J. Bell, president of the Northwest Suburban council for 1937, will be at the dinner to outline the program and discuss needs of scouting in the village of Barrington for 1937.

A summary of the scouting plans shows that there is still a debt of approximately \$1000 outstanding against the scout clubs. Last year \$100,000 was used to reduce a break-down of the expenditure on the four villages. The total of \$100,000 dollar goes to the district for special activities (in this case it goes to the Barrington and Palatine Troops), badges and awards (also in this case), and rallies receive 10c and other items

collected lower than. In all, there are 14 units which the individual dollar is not. The cost of organizing expenses is 15c.

"Mr. Bell stated, "It is in a great percentage directly to it. The cost is very low. In the Northwest Suburban council only one unit is a leader and more than 100 other men contribute their time and talents."

The local executive committee maintains the clubs and sponsors a program of training. The committee will be out this month to the program and discuss needs of scouting in the village of Barrington for 1937.
