New Fast Train Is Put on by the North Western

A non-stop express train from Barrington to Chicago, making the distance in 37 minutes, is being tried out by the Chicago and North Western railroad in response to a request from the Barrington Countryside Property Owners association.

The train which leaves daily at 8:33 a. m. was put on following change of time April 25. Whether it will be continued permanently will depend on the amount of patronage it receives, according to Sidine Grebe, chairman of the transportation committee.

This is the first non-stop express train and the fastest between Barrington and Chicago.

Groves Firm Low on Route 59 Job

S. J. Groves and Sons company of Libertyville was the lowest bidder for the contract to pave 5.18 miles of highway on route 59 extending north from route 23 to Wauconda. It was announced by the state highway department Saturday following the opening of bids Friday.

The bid of \$225,301 for the project by the Libertyville company placed the cost at \$46,900 a mile. The state highway department received bids totalling \$2,127,380 on projects in the various parts of the state, including the paving undertaking in Lake county. Contracts on those projects will be awarded at a later date.
