

Judging Team From Ela Wins First in Sectional Contest

Ela and Palatine high schools cooperated in entertaining the 25 schools in section II at a Fat Stock and Dairy Judging contest Saturday, May 15, at Lake Zurich.

Ela boys made an excellent showing. Five boys judged with scores of the high three making up the team scores. In the fat stock division, the Ela team placed first with 1033 points, followed by Sandwich 932, Hinckley 969, Plato Center 923, and Ryanboro 941.

In the individual judging, J. Weber of Ela came in first with the exceptionally good score of 374 points. P. Fatland, Sandwick 346, I. Bond, Waterman 344, D. Weber, Ela 328, and K. Russell, Plato Center 322, Elmer Grever of Ela placed 9th with 226 points and H. Gleason also of Ela placed 10th with 214 points.

In the dairy judging DeKalb placed first with 831 points, Antioch 819, Sandwick 845, Ela 846, Dundee 827. Ralph Grever of Ela carried off high individual honors in dairy with a score of 342. He was followed by Sebly, Sandwick 322, Carlson, Woodstock 320, Hart, Mavrogo 308, and Arroyo, Antioch 307.

Warren Nehmer were the two members of the Ela Dairy Judging team. One hundred boys competed in this division. In total points for the year Sandwick placed first, Ela second, and DeKalb third. Sandwick, Ela and Hinckley were the only schools of the 25 in section II to qualify all five teams for the state judging to be held at Urbana on June 17.

Reduce Night Rate for Telegraph Use

Reductions in rates for overnight telegraph services which will become effective June 1 will provide substantial savings to residents of Barrington. It was disclosed last night by Beatrice Berghorn, local manager of the Western Union Telegraph company, A tariff filed Saturday with the federal communications commission at Washington, D. C., will reduce the cost of both short and long messages and cut the telegraph bill of the nation by approximately \$3,000,000.

"The effect of these reductions," Mrs. Berghorn said, "is that the charge for 25 words will be the same as, and in some cases lower than, the present charge for a 10-word night message and that long messages can be sent at relatively even lower rates."

"The 10-word night message will be discontinued and the initial charge for night letters will be for 25 words instead of for 50 as at present. The maximum charge for a 25-word night letter will be 50c, even for the greatest distances in the United States."
