Ela High School Basketball Teams Start Practicing

Coach H. Wesner Has Group of 25 Working Out for Season's Opener

Coach H. L. Wesner, director of athletics at Ela township high school, served noticed informally this week that his 1937-38 basketball team will again be a source of discomfort to other schools in the Northwest conference. He has a group of 25 hard cut stars out in practice sessions, sharpening up on their "basket" eyes and getting the feel of the ball. At present and until early in November practice, will be limited due to conflict with other extra-curricular activities. Coach Wesner reported, but after that date he expects to send his charges through a vigorous training session.

During the 1936-37 season, Ela high school was the proverbial "apple cart upstetter"—for many larger schools. the scales at 160 pounds and is compactly put together. While Leuthesser may be regarded as the leader of this year's aggregation, L. Gleason and Schroeder, two regulars from last season's group, will furnish the floor power. In those three men, Wesner has his front line and must search among his reserves for two guards.
