**Postmaster Lists Dates for Mailing Christmas Parcels**

General and nearby points in Iowa, Wisconsin, and Indiana not later than Tuesday. Mail for nearby towns should be in the post office by the combined day and parcel for local delivery before Thursday noon.

These are the latest dates that mailing may be made with reasonable assurance of delivery. Earliest mailings, however, will materially assist postal employees.

As in former years, greeting cards enclosed in unsealed envelopes may be mailed at the third class rate of 1 1/2 cents. They may bear the name of the addressee and of the sender, and such simple inscriptions as "My dear Friend," "Sincerely yours," "Merry Christmas," "Happy New Year," "With Best Wishes," etc., but anything in the nature of a personal message will subject the card to the first class rate of postage. Cards mailed at the third class rate, if undeliverable, will not be forwarded or returned. They should be mailed a day or two earlier than those mailed at first class rates to insure delivery on time.

To conform to an order of Postmaster General Farley that all postal employees who can be spared shall have an opportunity to spend Christmas Day with their families, the rule that only gift parcels, special delivery, and perishable articles shall be delivered on Christmas Day is general throughout the country. Late mailers should bear in mind the special delivery provision and for distant points the combination air mail-special delivery should come to the rescue of those who recall a forgotten friend at the last minute. An air mail special delivery letter for Los Angeles, for instance, mailed in Barrington Friday morning, December 24, should be delivered on Christmas Day.
