## Spelling Contest of Rural Schools Will Take Place Saturday

The annual Cook county spelling contest under the supervision of county superintendent of schools will be held on Saturday morning, April 30th, at 10 A. M. in the civil service room of the city hall in Chicago.  
 Over 40,000 children from the 173 school districts directly under the supervision of Superintendent Puffer have taken part in the contest. Two delegates from each school have gone to the township contest held throughout the county. Banners have been awarded to the township champions. These township champions will compete in the final contest for the gold, silver, and bronze medals which will be awarded to the first, second, and third place winners.  
 "No text has been designated as the official text," said Mr. Puffer in commenting on this year's contest. "We will select the words from the text commonly used in our schools. We will try to avoid homonyms. Where there is a difference in spelling of a word in common use, the final authority will be the Merriam Edition of Webster's New International Unabridged Dictionary. We will use our final set of words as listed from the Chicago daily newspapers."
