In the strictest sense "boat" refers only to small craft such as a rowboat, lifeboat, launch, etc., propelled by oars. In the course of time both popularly and legally the term "ship" has acquired a wide interpretation. Broadly stated, for purposes of international maritime law and by the Merchants' Shipping acts of Great Britain (1854, 1894 and 1906) the term "ship" includes every description of vessel used in navigation not propelled by oars.

DO YOU KNOW ILLINOIS?

The secretary of state of Illinois is the state librarian ex-officio, much information concerning your state. Any questions which are the state library and archives division under his jurisdiction contains of particular interest to readers and which are not covered in this series will be answered immediately. Q. How many people in Illinois died of diabetes during the past year?
A. 2291.
Q. When was the "Des Moines Trail" discovered by white men?
A. About 1650. The trail led from the mouth of Bureau Creek on the Illinois river southwestwardly to the banks of the Mississippi river in Hancock county.

Q. How many National banks are there in Illinois with trust powers?
A. 74.
Q. How many trust companies are there in Illinois?
A. 37. Five of these were organized in Illinois and 22 are "foreign" companies located in other states.

Q. Is there a state pawners' society in Illinois?
A. Yes, the "First State Pawners' Society." It is located in Chicago.
Q. What township in Kankakee is named after a Potawatomi chief?
A. Yellow Head Township.

Q. What is the Indian name for Yellow Head?
A. Minnemaung, the name of a chief whose village was located a few miles north of the present city of Mokense, Ill.
Q. Who was Col. John O'Fallon?
A. A soldier, merchant and philanthropist. O'Fallon, a town in St. Clair county is named for him.

Q. When did Father Claude Allouez take up Marquette's missionary work among the Kankakees?
A. April 27, 1677.
Q. Why did Allouez choose this particular tribe?
A. Marquette promised this tribe he would return to them and on his death bed asked Allouez to take his place and fulfill his promise for him.

Q. What form of capital punishment is used in Illinois?
A. Electrocution.
Q. Since when has electrocution been the form of capital punishment in Illinois?
A. Since July 1, 1927.
Q. How many Illinois men were taken prisoners during the last war?
A. 204. 12 officers and 192 enlisted men.

Q. How many deaths occurred in Illinois from 1930 to 1936 by violence in prohibition enforcement conflicts?
A. 21 prohibition agents and 22 civilians.
Q. How many penal institutions and reformatories are there in Illinois?
A. There are seven of these institutions and reformatories. 47,927 inmates were cared for by these institutions last year.

Q. How many justices are there in the Illinois supreme court?
A. There are seven justices corresponding to the seven electoral justices in the state.
Q. When was the Public Defender's office established in Cook county?
A. September, 1930.
Q. What is the duty of this office?
A. To represent in the criminal court of Cook county those who are financially unable to obtain legal defense.

Q. When was this office established by law?
A. The Illinois state legislature on July 1, 1933 created the office of the Public Defender in the criminal court. That statute provides that the Public Defender be appointed by the circuit and supreme court judges of Cook county.

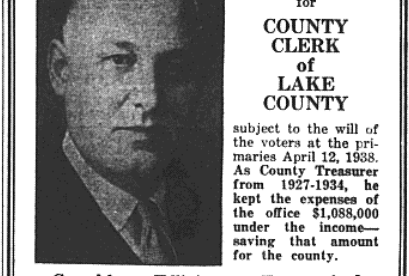
