

Great Increase in Suburban Building in 1937 Reported

Building in the Chicago suburban region during 1937 amounted to \$35,646,013, an increase of \$8,505,828 or 31 per cent over 1936 when the total was \$27,140,185. The tremendous increase that has

occurred is indicated by the fact that the 1937 total surpasses the combined totals of 1932 to 1935 inclusive by over four and a half million dollars. The figures for 1937 and 1936 mentioned on a month by month basis are as follows: 1937 1936 January \$1,526,770 \$ 797,681 February 1,345,122 1,115,633 March 3,866,255 2,732,623

It was noted that \$27,340,184 with only \$19,000 of new building was the lowest of all months since the depression began, and that the upward climb was slow until March 1935, when every month began to show a million dollars or more of suburban building.
