

Andrew Janson, 81, Dies at Home of His Daughter, Mrs. Fray

Andrew Janson died at the home of his daughter, Mrs. William Fray of S. Hager avenue Friday after a lingering illness. He was 81 years old.

Funeral services were held at the Fray home Tuesday afternoon with Rev. Herman Koenig officiating. Burial took place at Acacia cemetery, Chicago, where Rev. Johnson of Chicago read the service.

Andrew Janson was born at Trollhattan, Sweden, March 12, 1856. He came to America in 1897 and became established in business in Chicago. He married Thekla Johanson in 1882.

Mr. Janson was a civil engineer for the E. Cummings Co. for years. Following his retirement from business 27 years ago, Mr. Janson lived on an estate near Lake Forest, later moving to Barrington to make his home with his daughter. He had lived here nine years.
