With watermelons plentiful we are hoping you will enjoy this excellent recipe for pickled rinds, delicious with meats all year.

For our luncheon menu this week we suggest tuna souffle, a tossed salad of tomato, cucumber, celery, radishes and a bit of onion, marinated in French dressing, bearnese rolls, or homemade bread, iced tea and watermelon slices served on grape leaves and garnished with sprigs of mint. Here are the recipes you may want:

WATERMELON PICKLES Peel, cut and soak watermelon rinds in salted water overnight. Boil in the following syrup: 4 1/2 lbs. sugar, 1 quart elder vinegar, 1/4 teaspoon oil of cinnamon, 1/4 teaspoon oil of cloves.

TUNA SOUFFLE 1 cup cream sauce, 1 can tuna, 4 heaping tablespoons noodle rings, cooked (about 1 cup when drained), Serve with mushroom sauce (melted mushroom soup).

BEATEN ROLLS 1/4 cup milk, 1/4 cup sugar, 1 teaspoon salt, 2 tablespoons shortening, 2 eggs. Bring above to boil on stove while beating 1/4 cup cold milk and 1 egg.

BRREAD 2 cakes yeast, 2 tablespoons sugar, 3 tablespoons salt, 8 cups water (or half water and half milk), 25 cups flour, 4 tablespoons shortening.
