Members of the Garden Club of Barrington were most delighted over the outcome of their Country Home and Garden Tour on Friday afternoon.

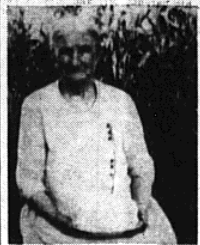
In spite of heavy clouds and drenching showers throughout the morning preparations went galli on and clearing skies just after noon rewarded the constance of garden club women.
