

High School Cagers Split Twin Bill With Crystal Lake Here Saturday

To Open Conference Schedule in Games at Heights Friday

Bronchos Suffer First Defeat, 39 to 24; Ponies Win 17 to 9

In the opening game of the 1933-34 basketball season here Saturday night, the Barrington Bronchos lost a hard-fought battle to the Crystal Lake 29, 24-24. The game was close throughout, but the visitors grabbed an early lead and gradually increased it as the game progressed. Though the Bronchos lost, they showed a lot of team spirit which future opponents will have to overcome.

The leader of Crystal Lake's offensive attack was Etling, who made 17 points, eight baskets and one free throw. The first quarter was evenly played, ending with the score 10-9 in favor of Crystal Lake. In the second quarter the Crystal Lakers strengthened their lead to a margin of six points, 24-18. In the next period, however, Barrington came back with some drive and fancy shots to make the score 25-24. At this point the tide turned again, and the Bronchos failed to get one tally in the last period, while the opponents added eleven points to their total.

The Bronchos' next game is at Arlington Heights Friday night.

There was little action in the first quarter, the visitors making two points and holding Barrington scoreless. After this, however, there was no doubt of the superiority of the Ponies. They tallied 17 points in the three quarters, while allowing Crystal Lake to score only seven.

Ship Island in Mississippi was reserved for military purposes by the executive order of August 30, 1847. In 1861 the island was occupied by Confederate troops. In September, 1861, the United States naval forces took possession of the island. The present works on the island were commenced in 1862. Ship Island was used as a base for military operations in the gulf from that time on. It was sold in 1933 to the Joe Graham post, No. 119, of the American Legion.
