For many years physicists here and abroad knew the basic principle of the incandescent electric lamp. Time and again various men attempted to make such lamps by putting a carbon rod in a vacuum within a gas container and then running an electric current through the rod. But always such heat developed that the lamp burst the moment it was lighted. Modern lighting had to wait until Edison got the idea that if the carbon filament were made fine enough, no such heat would be developed, tried it and it worked.
