Graduates Offer Suggestions for Maintaining Employment

Once an individual has a job the next thing to consider is how to keep that job. Various suggestions are advanced by B. H. S. graduates of classes '23-'27 in the questionnaire sent them this spring.

Some of the women give the following advice: "Do your work thoroughly and do not try to be too speedy."

"Be alert, keep 'on your toes,' cooperate willingly and well with others, work for the good of your company, be pleasant in your attitude toward your work, your superiors, and your fellow workers."

"The trouble with most people after they get their jobs they quit." Be conscientious, cooperative, work overtime if necessary and be friendly with your co-workers.

"Be equipped with education to fill the position. 2.—Seek to know as much as possible about working and routine of the business so that you may be able to shoulder some of the employer's responsibilities—create for him the utmost confidence in you. 3.—Be willing to put in hours of over-kind."

time when asked and at times on your own initiative. 4.—Be cheerful and congenial to everyone regardless of how difficult it may be at times. 5.—Be willing to cooperate with fellow employees. 6.—Dress immaculately and suitably. 7.—Continue education in some evening school."

"Don't have too much ego, but do have self-confidence. Work intelligently. Don't waste company's time. Never gossip, keep ears and eyes open but keep mouth shut. Think deeply at all times."

"Study the job to familiarize yourself with the position, increase efficiency, and win promotion. Learn to be generally agreeable (hoping others will do likewise). Protect your health. Be well groomed and well mannered."

"The first job is the most important from the viewpoint of experience. A second job is a test of whether or not the first vocation chosen is the one you want to follow and the third job you will want to keep by using a day of experience, common sense, and initiative."

"The men pass on these following helpful hints: 'Always keep yourself looking for new things to learn. Don't always be thinking about lunch and quitting time. 'Continue education by home study or night school. Ask your superiors for questions about the work and remember what you are told.'

"With I knew, but would like to advise them to get a job where they do not spend a great deal of time and coming from work. If a person is tired by the time work starts, he can't do his best."

"Be on the alert for new ways of doing the job better. Improve your work constantly. 2.—Marry the boss' daughter." "Work hard from the start and always show a willingness to be of

service at all times. Do your job and then some, but don't be foolish and do someone else's job. Above all things stay out of office 'politics'."

"In my opinion a person gets out of something only as much as he puts in and in most places I think this applies to a person's job."

The above suggestions are based on the experience of B. H. S. graduates and should be of assistance to high school students especially. Barring economic causes, they should give one a general insight on how to keep a job, Miss Christenson reported.
