Emergency crop and feed loans are available to farmers unable to obtain credit from any other source who are in need of immediate assistance in the financing of their 1933 crops or in the feeding of their livestock. It was reported this week. Acton A. Shelton, local field supervisor, stated that applications are now being taken at Arlington Heights by the Cook county farm bureau which is assisting farmers in filling out of the applications. The amount which may be loaned to any one farmer in 1933 may not exceed \$400 and will be limited to the farmer's immediate and actual cash needs. Farmers who can obtain the funds they need from an individual bank, production credit association, or other concern are not eligible for crop and feed loans from the emergency crop and feed loan section of the farm credit administration, it was learned.
