

Northwest Suburban Council Plans Concert for Camp Fund

Sponsored by the camping committee of the Northwest Suburban Council, Boy Scouts of America, a concert by the 35-piece Illinois Symphony orchestra will be given at the large auditorium of the Des Plaines Methodist camp grounds Thursday evening, June 23, at 8:15 o'clock.

Proceeds from the sale of tickets will make it possible for a number of scouts to have a summer vacation at camp Oh-Da-Ko-Ta, six miles east of Lake Geneva. The camp is being put in readiness and the Northwest Suburban Council is hoping to give a larger number of lads than formerly the advantages of camp life.

The Illinois Symphony orchestra will be under the expert direction of Isler Solomon, the young conductor who has made a meteoric rise to fame and has helped to put the Illinois Symphony on the map as one of the outstanding organizations of its kind in the country. His highly successful previous appearances at Grant park, where hundreds of thousands of music

lovers have witnessed Solomon's brilliant conducting, has resulted in his being re-engaged for a series of five concerts this summer.

Solomon will direct a popular symphony program designed to appeal to all music lovers, it was reported. It will include works which the orchestra has played during its season of 38 concerts on Sunday afternoons at the Great Northern theatre in Chicago, closing June 26.

The accident occurred in the curve of Northwest highway near Grimm's service station. Severa was enroute to Berwyn with a group of friends following a skating party at Fox River Grove. According to testimony, Severa had stopped on the highway to clear his windshield of sleet. Bauman's car approached from the north and as it reached the curve went into a skid. Severa was caught between the two cars and received severe compound fractures of both legs. Members of his party were uninjured as was Bauman.

of the country here seems to be low and swampy it is surprisingly free from malaria judging from reports of the natives—this is quite a contrast to Coron where the mortality from malaria was very high.

Catalan—April 28
"We arrived here yesterday and

Joined the steward whom we were especially glad to see as she had a load of mail for us. This town is the most native and primitive we have seen yet; nearly all of the buildings are of nipa and they seem to have more than the usual allotment of pigs. The only white people here are two Russians, both of whom were formerly in the Imperial navy. They were very hospitable to us and appeared to enjoy taking us around the settlement.
