

Three Loves Has Nancy at Catlow Sunday, Monday

"Spawn of the North" Opens Wednesday for Three Day Showing

Starring Edward G. Robinson, "Am The Law," thrilling drama of big-city racketeering opens on Friday at the Catlow for a two day showing. Supporting the star is a strong cast including Wendy Barrie, Barbara O'Neill, Otto Kruger, John Best, Arthur Loft, Gene Morgan, Robert Middleton, Douglas Woods and Max Linder.

Smartly dialogued, brimming with laughs, and offering finished and believable characterizations by such stellar performers as Janet Gaynor, Robert Montgomery and Franchot Tone, "Three Loves Has Nancy," comes to the Catlow Theatre on Sunday and Monday as one of the most refined and original comedies seen here in some time.

The story is that of a flippant novelist who gets into difficulties with a Broadway actress. In an endeavor to escape the overtures of the too eager admirer he persuades his publisher to send him on a lecture tour of the South. Here he meets Nancy, a small-town girl. Casually inviting her to seek his help should she ever get into trouble in New York, he forgets all about her, until she comes knocking at the penthouse apartment he shares with his friend, the publisher, upon his return.

The ensuing complications provide some of the funniest and merriest comedy seen this season. One of the happy features of the Jones Family is that there are no favorites, either within the group itself or in story treatment. Each successive film of the popular series gives prominence to different members of the family, but the others are never far in the background. A well-rounded company and the Joneses get along famously.

"Safety in Numbers," latest of the series, comes to the Catlow Tuesday as part of a double feature offering.

The other feature is "Freshman Year," with Dixie Dunbar, William Lundigan and Constance Moore. In his latest picture "Spawn of the North" Akim Tamiroff, the famed character actor, worked under the direction of the man who gave him his first big chance in Hollywood, it was Henry Hathaway, maker of many screen successes, who several seasons ago cast Tamiroff as the Indian emir in his "Lives of a Bengal Lancer" and started the Russian star on his climb to fame.

When "Spawn of the North" opens at the Catlow Theatre next Wednesday for a three day engagement, Tamiroff will be seen as the swashbuckling leader of a gang of Alaskan sea raiders.

File Damage Suits for Crash Injuries

Suit was filed by Miss Rosette Kreuzer, 20 years old, 2114 Bissell street, Chicago, against Mrs. Geraldine Sexton, 25 years old, wife of Thomas Sexton, Chicago wholesale food distributor, in superior court of Cook county this week asking \$15,000 damages for personal injuries alleged to have been received in an auto crash here July 22.

The accident occurred during a rainstorm on the Northwest highway about a mile west of Barrington. Miss Kreuzer claims that the Sexton car was in the wrong lane when the crash occurred. Both women were injured and removed to the Sherman hospital in Elgin.

A suit totalling \$45,000 for auto accident injuries has been filed in the Cook county circuit court by Mr. and Mrs. Jack Momian and children, Richard and Diana against Walter Giden. The complaint alleges Giden's car collided with that containing the Momians at Wheeling on September 5. Mr. Momian asks \$5000 damages, his wife \$20,000 and the children \$10,000 each.

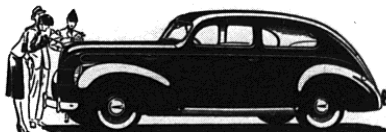

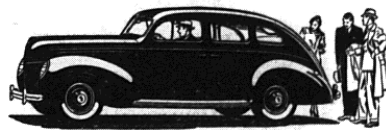

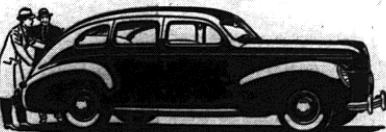
