

Broncho Eleven Scores First Grid Victory of Season in Final Game

Defeat Grant Team by 21-0 Margin at Fox Lake Saturday

Locals Pile Up Three Touchdowns in Closing Tilt to Escape Last Place

In their final game of the season, the Barrington Bronchos overcame the Grant high eleven in a crushing defeat, 21-0 at Fox Lake Saturday afternoon. It was their first victory of the season, and after the first quarter there was no doubt of Barrington's superiority. It was the last game of their high school football career for 14 seniors, and they came through in grand style.

During the first quarter, the ball was kept entirely in Barrington territory. On the second play of the next quarter, however, Church punted from midfield. Grant fumbled the ball near their goal line, and Watson fell on the ball on the Grant one-inch line. Then Kampert went over for the score. A lateral from Shepard to Herren scored the extra point, the first one of the season for the Bronchos, making the score 7-0.

The score remained thus until the third quarter when Grabenkort blocked a punt and recovered the ball on Grant's 38-yard line. On two runs, the ball was moved to the 20 yard line. Then Church passed to Wilkins over the goal for the Broncho's second touchdown. Shepard passed to Wilkins for the extra point, putting Barrington into the lead, 14-0.

Grant threatened to score early in the last quarter, when they succeeded in advancing the ball to the Broncho 18 yard line. At this point, however, Shepard intercepted a pass on his own 3 yard line and dashed down the field on a beautiful run to the Grant 12 yard line, a gain of 36 yards. The Bronchos could get no farther, and the ball exchanged hands a number of times.

Later in the quarter, Church punted from his own 45 yard line. Grant again fumbled the ball, and Kampert recovered it for Barrington—on the home team's 3 yard line. On the next play Church took the ball over for a touchdown. Shepard kicked the extra point right between the bars, making the score 21-0, as it remained throughout the game.

The Bronchos made five first downs to Grant's three and completed three out of twelve passes

to the home team's record of three out of seven. Grant intercepted one pass but the Bronchos intercepted six, this being one of the reasons Grant failed to score. The Bronchos punted eight times while Grant made five kicks.
