### William Wascher, 56, Prominent Cary Man, Dies; Rites Monday

Funeral services for William Wascher, 56 years old, prominent Cary resident, were held at the late residence in Cary Monday afternoon with Rev. Stanley G. Steyer officiating. Burial was in Algonquin cemetery.

Mr. Wascher died at his home in Cary Friday morning following a brief illness. He had returned home from Mayo Bros. clinic in Rochester, Minn., the day previous.

Member of a pioneer McHenry county family, he was a lifelong resident of Cary and operated the coal and ice business founded by his father, the late William Wascher, in 1893.

Mr. Wascher served as highway commissioner in Algonquin township for 20 years, was prominent in republican politics, was a director of the Cary State bank and one of the founders of the Cary County club.

Surviving him are his widow, Dagmar Peterson Wascher; a daughter, Mrs. Lois Nowicki; two sisters, Mrs. Harry Gilbertson of Cary and Miss Emma Wascher of San Benito, Tex., and a brother Albert, also of San Benito.

### Col. John Roberts, 72, Chicago Packer, Dies; Rites Monday

Funeral services for Col. John Roberts, Revere Knoll, Cuba township, founder of the Roberts & Oake packing firm, were held at Bond chapel at the University of Chicago Monday afternoon. Burial was in Mt. Hope cemetery.

Mr. Roberts died early Saturday morning at his home here of a heart attack. He was 72 years old.

Mr. Roberts was born at Kilke, County Clare, Ireland, on June 14, 1861 and came to this country at the age of 18 years. He settled in Chicago and in 1895 organized the Roberts & Oake firm. In 1927 on his retirement as head of the firm he gave \$1,000,000 to the University of Chicago to endow the Bob Roberts Memorial hospital for children in memory of his son.

During the World war, Mr. Roberts served as lieutenant colonel. At the time of his death he was chairman of Miller & Hart.

He is survived by his widow, Mrs. Mary Shannon Roberts, and two children by a former marriage, John Oake Roberts and Mrs. Marie Hodgkinson.
