

Barrington Bronchos Lose Hard Fought Game to Lake Forest, 18 to 6

Libertyville Here Saturday for Last Home Game of Year

Herren Makes Lone Touchdown in Contest Played Friday

In a hard and roughly played game, the Lake Forest eleven defeated the Barrington Bronchos 18-6 last Friday at Lake Forest. Both teams gave all they had, and for a while it looked as if the Bronchos might come out on top, but they finally succumbed to the Lake Forest power.

There was no scoring in the first quarter, but early in the second period Shepard intercepted a pass by Peschmann on his own 15 yard line and ran down the field to Lake Forest's 26 yard line. Then Church passed over right end to Nestlerode to the 12. From here, Shepard took the ball through center to the 4 yard line, and on fourth down Herren skirted around left end for a touchdown. The try for extra point was no good, leaving the score 6-0 in favor of Barrington, and putting them into the lead for the first time this season.

This lead was not for long, however. Several plays later Church kicked from back in his own territory to the Lake Forest 15 yard line. On the next play, Peschmann, who is one of the smartest and speediest runners Barrington has seen all season, dashed through left tackle on the second 23 yard run for a touchdown. The try for conversion was no good, leaving the score a 6-6 tie, the half ending without further score.

As soon as the second half got underway, Peschmann again went on a rampage. Lake Forest ran Barrington's kickoff back to their own 44 yard line and then Peschmann again took the ball through left tackle, this time for 26 yards to the Barrington 30 yard line. Several plays later, he carried the ball the remaining 30 yards around right end for Lake Forest's second touchdown. This put Lake Forest into the lead 12-6, the try for extra point failing.

Early in the last quarter, Lake Forest recovered a Barrington fumble on the Broncho 27 yard line. Then Peschmann dashed around left end and for what everybody thought was a touchdown, but Keith Kampert managed to come from behind and tackle the runner on the 5 yard line. This just put off the touchdown, however, because three plays later O'Hara went through center for the score. The try for point again failed, making the score 18-6 in favor of Lake Forest, as it remained through the rest of the game. The Bronchos made 9 first downs to the home team's 7, and completed four out of seven passes while Lake Forest failed to connect in five attempts. The Bronchos punted five times and made three fumbles;

After fighting hard the four quarters, the Ponies found themselves exactly where they had started. In the first quarter neither team came near the opposing team's goal line, but in the closing minutes of the first half Northbrook advanced the ball from their own 40 yard line to Barrington's five yard line on a run and two complete passes. At this point, however, the gun ending the half went off, saving Barrington from a possible defeat. The third quarter was uneventful, but in the last period, Northbrook again threatened to score. On a series of short running plays, aided by a 16 yard penalty against Barrington for unnecessary roughness, the visitors got the ball to the Pony five yard line. But they could get no farther, and Barrington took possession of the ball on downs and promptly kicked out of danger. The game ended several plays later.

The Ponies made only one first down to Northbrook's seven and failed to complete a pass out of five attempts. Northbrook completed four out of nine passes. Barrington kicked six times, while the visitors punted four times.

The Ponies' last game of the season is next Monday at Libertyville.
