Report Shows Wide Spreads in School District Valuations

The valuation per resident high school pupil is more than 25 times as large in some school districts of Illinois as the valuation in other districts. The valuations range from \$3602 for Christopher community high school, Franklin county, to \$78,000 for Colusa, Hancock county; while a similar figure for the non-high school district of Monroe county is \$91,253, according to a study of 1937 assessments and 1937 attendance data, issued this week by the research department of the Illinois Education association.

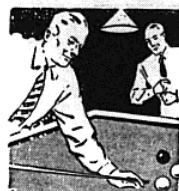
