





### Suburban Residence Construction Gets Off to Good Start

Home building in the Chicago suburbs is not almost as good a start in January this year as it was in March of last year with permits taken out for nearly three times as many houses as in any month of this year as the same month of last year. A survey of new building in the Chicago suburban region completed by the U. S. Census Bureau shows that in January 1932 permits were issued for 125 houses, or 600 more than in any other month of the year. The total for the month is \$1,928,445. The January 1932 permits were issued in 1931 for 163 homes to cost \$2,812,645.

The January 1932 total for all types of construction, including homes, apartments, stores, public and industrial buildings, is \$1,987,392. This represents not only the regular seasonal decline from the January 1931 activity but also a decrease in comparison with January 1930, for which the total was \$2,459,371. The seasonal decline is normal. The falling off for the month as compared with a year ago has little or no significance for the Bureau for January 1932 construction permits of homes to suit any month.
