Tax Rates Increase for Suburban Towns

The 1939 rate made the bills for Cook county about will be slightly higher than those of 1937. It was announced last week by County Clerk Michael J. Flynn, due to reductions in assessed ratings rather than increased government levies. Increase ranges from 1 to 5 per cent with few of the country towns show a decrease. Barrington's 1938 tax rate was \$4.16 for each hundred dollars of assessed valuation, an increase of three cents over the 1937 rate. Barrington's rate remained the same \$4.21. Waukegan's increased from 14.84 to 14.85 and the town of Palatine, to be increased by additional levies, to \$4.25, seven cents above the 1937 figure.

AN ORDINANCE NO. 280 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AN ORDINANCE OF THE VILLAGE OF BARRINGTON.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Barrington, Cook and Lake Counties, Illinois, that Ordinance No. 277, regulating the sale of fireworks be and the same be amended by adding therein the following sections to wit: SECTION 1. ALL FIREWORKS. That no person, firm or corporation, shall, on or before the 31st day of June in any calendar year, offer for sale, lease or give away to any retail dealer, consumer in the Village any toy pistol, toy gun, toy cannon, blank cartridge, firecracker, rocket, shell, colored fire or any article or substance of an explosive nature destined or intended to be used as fireworks, without first obtaining a license to do so.

SECTION 2. LICENSE FEE. The License fee which shall be paid by any person, firm or corporation for the sale of toy pistol, toy gun, toy cannon, blank cartridge, firecracker, rocket, torpedo, shell, colored fire or any article or substance of an explosive nature, destined or intended to be used as fireworks, shall be the sum of

Twenty-five (\$25.00) Dollars per year.

SECTION 3. PENALTY. Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be fined not less than \$10.00 nor more than \$75.00 (\$50.00) Dollars for each offense.

SECTION 4. That this ordinance shall be full force and effect from and after its passage, and approval, and publication according to law.
