

17 per cent making the payment on this farm equal to \$1.19 per acre. \$1.19 multiplied by 20 acres equals \$23.80. That figure is multiplied by 40 acres, making a total payment on the general allotment of \$952.80. The other payments available on the farm may be saved by every crop, such as raising or feeding legumes. The amount that may be saved by this method is based on the number of acres of non-leguminous crops and is determined in the following manner:

Each acre of non-leguminous crops will earn 10 cents. There there are 17 acres of non-leguminous crops on this farm this sum will amount to \$170.00.

Adding the corn, wheat and general payments above a total of \$1242.80 which may be saved by full participation of this farm in the A.A. Farm program in 1929. The amount that may be saved is payable to the farmer in the form of a check payable to participate completely with each partial payment for 1929.
