

Town Assessors Begin Quadrennial Real Assessments

Anticipate Taxable Property Increase Due to New Building

Assessors in the 18 Lake county townships this week began quadrennial assessment of improved and unimproved real estate in their respective townships. The 1939 assessment books, which will carry the property valuations in the county during the next four years, were turned over Friday by County Clerk Jay B. Stone to the assessors.

An effort will be made to equalize the assessment for taxing purposes. It was determined at a meet-

ing of all assessors last Wednesday, E. J. Maynard, of the state commission, said that the real property assessment in Lake county for taxing purposes during the next four years will be varied between 14 and 25 per cent of the 1935 valuation.

Real property values in Lake county in 1935 totaled \$24,941,575, compared to \$46,193,686 in 1937, or an increase of 84.92 per cent. The opinion among the lake assessors is that the increase in the quadrennial assessment this year will be about 15 per cent. Personal property valuations will also be made by the assessors. The 1939 personal property assessment for 1938 totaled \$1,247,549, or an increase of \$1,742,971, or a decrease of 11.70 per cent. The town assessors annually complete their assessments. Their books will be turned over to the county clerk by the town assessors, who in turn will bring the books before the board for equalization.


