Wood Shows 'Preston' Origin, Derived from the Latin word for 'village of grapes', 'vinea'.

The name was in one time restricted to the small red wine grape grown in the hills and valleys of the Piedmont region in northern Italy, and during a year of relative isolation there it was used to designate the wine. The earliest printed grape vine was in 1546 and the later one came in the late 1600s. Only 36 acres were planted in the vine and now on shallow trays two feet wide, three feet long and one foot high, on which the grapes are allowed to grow and ripen. The vines are trained to climb by simply placing an arched trellis over the vines, then turning both ends up and taking it off the top tray. After the grapes are dried they are stored away in great barrels until they are packed and prepared for shipment.
