Bottom yeast in lukewarm water. Place sugar, fat and salt in bowl and add the hot milk. Cool and add 1 cup of flour and beat 8 minutes. Add dissolved yeast and enough flour to make soft dough. Knead until dough is smooth and does not stick to hands. Let rise until dough is double in bulk. Shape dough in 8 small balls for each roll, place in muffin tin and brush tops with melted butter. Cover, let rise until double in bulk and bake in hot oven 400° to 15 to 20 minutes.

TOMATO ANCH' SALAD 1 can tomato juice 1 can tomato soup 1 cup boiling water. Stir and season.

CLOVER LEAF ROLL 1 cake yeast 1 cup milk 1 tablespoon sugar 1 teaspoon salt 1 tablespoon lard 2 to 3 cups flour. 1 egg.

SWEET OR HOUR CREAM CAKE 1 cup sugar 1/2 cup milk 1 egg sweet or sour cream 1/2 cup flour 1 teaspoon baking powder. Beat, flouring to salt, extract or spices.

Use dry ingredients. Beat eggs and add to cream and last add sifted dry ingredients, beating hard until smooth and light. When pour cream is used add 1 teaspoon vanilla only. 1 teaspoon baking powder. Heat in two layers in moderate oven 400° about 20 minutes. Use any desired icing.
