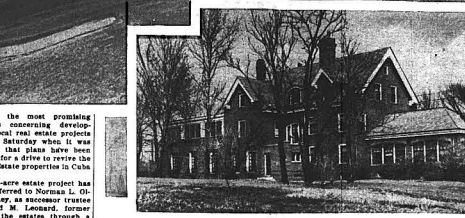
It was such a sensational success that he has now come on the screen as a naive character and has continued for the second time in pictures which opens at the Catlow for three day engagements Wednesday.
