Two seasonal recipes for strawberries and raspberries, and a requested recipe for barbecued succatras are offered our readers this week.

CANNED STRAWBERRIES. Work with not more than three quarts of strawberries at a time. Wash, stem and measure and to each quart of berries add one cup of sugar. Put in layers in a preserving bottle and let stand for two hours. Strain juice will be drawn out of the fruit during this time so that it will not be necessary to add any liquid. Boil gently for two or three minutes without stirring. Let berries stand overnight, so that they become plump. The following morning fill hot sterilized jars and seal them on the rack of the oven which has been preheated to 275 degrees. Be sure that the jars do not touch each other on the top or sides of the oven. Process for just 10 minutes, then remove from oven and seal the jars.

A combination of the opposite-heat and jar-closed methods of

cooking, keeps the berries plump and ripe in color.

RHUBARB MARSHALADE. Cut rhubarb very fine. Mix two cups rhubarb with juice and pulp of one orange and one teaspoon of ground rice, one tablespoon whole juice and 1 1/2 cups sugar. Let stand overnight and then strain. Dissolved. Boil rapidly until evaporated, then add chopped almonds or walnuts. Boil up once more and add sugar. Seal in one quart with paraffin.

BARBECUED SPARKBERRIES. Have 2 lbs. of soft succatras.

Wash. Add 1/2 lb. Raisins.

Put in hot suitable for serving. Place in baking dish, allow two minutes over top and add a mixture of the following: 1/2 cup mayonnaise, 1/2 teaspoon tobacco sauce, 1/2 teaspoon catsup, 1/2 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce, 1/2 teaspoon onion juice, 1/2 teaspoon lemon juice and 1/2 cups sugar. Let stand overnight and then strain. Dissolved. Boil rapidly until evaporated, then add chopped almonds or walnuts. Boil up once more and add sugar. Seal in one quart with paraffin.


