Joseph Kupchera, 78-year-old caretaker of the Chicago and North Western locomotive which ran over him in Fox River Grove, was instantly killed Sunday night when he walked in front of a south bound C. & N.W. passenger train at the Grove depot. He apparently failed to see the train as it started across the platform of the passenger depot.

The train was slowly approaching the depot stop. The locomotive's warning signal was in operation but Kupchera did not notice it. He stepped onto the tracks at 11:42 and was hit by the locomotive. His body was hurled between the rails and the entire train "passed over" him.


