

**New Payment Plan for Back Taxes Created by H. B. 51**

**Lake County Owners May Delinquencies in Five Installments**

Lake county property owners who pay their current tax bills on or before September 1, will have two weeks to pay the back taxes or may avoid the penalty by contracting with the county treasurer to pay the delinquent taxes in the regular bi-monthly installments. This new law made possible by House Bill 51 which was passed by the Illinois General Assembly in June, 1937.

County Treasurer Charles E. Hagan, in a letter to property owners, stated that the new law requires that property owners who are delinquent in their taxes as of January 1, 1937, may on or before September 1, 1937, enter into the regular bi-monthly installments of the tax.


