Predictions that all previous records for number of entries will be broken are made by the management of the International Live Stock exposition for this year's show, which will be held at the West Coast from Friday December 1 to Friday, January 12, 1940.

According to H. H. Heide, secretary-treasurer of the exposition, the early entry in the livestock has ever been more than the usual number of stockmen have made inquiries relative to listing exhibitors.

More than 100,000 will be awarded to stockmen in each prize. The premiums will be spread over competition for 10 different breeds of cattle, horses, sheep and swine, which will total over 10,000 head.
