Oct.; Total \$12,860

Despite a sharp decrease com-
pared with the total of last month,
building activity in the village of
Barrington maintained an even
level during the month of October,
according to a check of permits
issued by V. O. Hawley, building
commissioner. The total of docu-
ments was 212, \$10,410 and 1,260
was \$12,860. In August of this
year building work reached a
high of \$23,975.

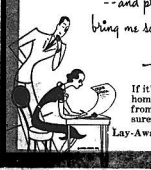
Conduct Rites for John G. Baker, 77
