Grant Handcuffs Bronchos Here in Grid Final, 19 to 16

Close Season With 3 Wins, 1 Tie and 3 Losses, for 500

Bulgolds Obtain Revenge for Defeat Earlier in Season

The Barrington high school season wound up this afternoon season disastrously when they were defeated by the Grant Bulldogs 19 to 16 at Northside varsity Saturday. The Bronchos seemed to have lost the wits and were that they exhibited at Northbrook the week before. Early in the first quarter, W. Zimmerman, the Barrington quarterback, fumbled on a 50 yard line and the ball was recovered by the Grant Bulldogs. Then, Coach Kooch, the Grant head coach, backfield men, carried the ball on short line plunges and set the machine down to the 17 yard line in short plays, from where Kooch was able to tackle the Bronchos touch-down.

Coach Kooch line broke through to tackle the runner trying for the yard line. Later in the second quarter Myers returned Chicago punt all the way to the Grant 14 yard line. Coach Myers then long passed right tackle the only Bronchos touch-down of the game.

The extra point try failed, the score remaining a 6-4 to the end of the half.

At the start of the third period, Kooch's pass was intercepted with all receiving end, getting right to the ball the Barrington 25 yard line. Grant made a 10 yard run later, Coach Myers over right end and the Bronchos were on the field. The Bulldog touch-down was the game. The pass for extra point failed, making the score 12-6.

Five minutes after the Grant got the ball down to the Bronchos on the 10 yard line, getting right from here Coach Kooch passed left tackle for a first down on the 19 yard line.

On the following play Coach Myers threw a 19 yard line right tackle for Grant's third touch-down. The Bronchos were on the field. The pass for extra point failed, making the score 19-6.

The Grant season was much improved over the time when the Bronchos clashed with them at Fox Lake and defeated them 14-0 Saturday the Bronchos couldn't seem to get their running game working and the line wasn't as strong as they had been. Several times the secondary reached up close to the line for good passes.

The Bronchos made six first downs to the opponents and three white both teams passed six times. Barrington completed three out of eleven passes, and the Bulldogs three out of ten. The Bronchos intercepted two passes, and the three Grant interceptions were successful. The Bronchos were successful in the check of the Barrington offense.


