### Start Drive for \$40 Primary Vote in Lake County

County Officers Assure They Will Seek to Be Re-Elected

Activity for the 1940 election campaign will open its public view in Lake County when the present county officers at their public address, announced their intention of seeking re-election at the primary election to be held April 9, 1940 and the general election on November 5.

Inquiries are being received at the Barrington post office concerning the approximate mailing dates in this country of articles intended for Christmas delivery abroad.

The disrupted situation in Europe, Mr. Padock said, has made setting for transatlantic deliveries irregular, and stamp duty on parcels is not being collected.

For this reason, matters of Christmas articles intended for delivery to Europe and other trans-Atlantic countries are urged to mail them as early as possible in the present month.

Parcel post service, including Germany, Poland, and Czechoslovakia has been suspended and is under other European countries.

Last mailings to Central American countries, Christmas deliveries are: Argentina, Paraguay, and Uruguay, Dec. 1; Bolivia, Dec. 2; Brazil, Ecuador, Guatem, Nicaragua, Honduras, Costa Rica, El Salvador, Dec. 3; Panama, Dec. 4; Puerto Rico, and the Virgin Islands, Dec. 5.

Mail to Dec. 15. Mailings from Dec. 15 to Dec. 31, Dec. 15; South China and the Philippines, Dec. 1; North China, Hong Kong, Manchuria, Dec. 15.

To allow time for articles to go through the customs, parcels are urged to be dispatched from New York through Barrington five days to ten in advance of dates shown in the schedule.

Parcels from Barrington sent from Pacific ports should be mailed to the post office in Chicago, Ill., the postmaster pointed out.
