Delivers Talk on Christian Science at Public School

Thomas E. Hurley, C.S.B., of Louisville, Ky., Speaks Tuesday Evening

Thomas E. Hurley, C.S.B., of Louisville, Ky., member of the Board of Lecturers of the Mother Church, The First Church of Christ, Scientist, in Boston, Mass., delivered a talk on "Christian Science: The Science of True Health" at the public school auditorium Tuesday evening under the auspices of First Church of Christ, Scientist, Barrington.

The lecturer spoke substantially as follows: "The divine demand, 'Work out your own salvation,' confronts each of us today, and the method prescribed and used by the Master Jesus is the truth, and the truth shall make you free." The truth about what? The truth about one's self—the Science of Health. And from what is this truth to free us? From ill and suffering, and the truth would free us merely in some particular respect, such as from ill, but it would make us free—free is every respect, which means freedom from all physical ailments, from sickness, disease, death, lack of food, unemployment, unpopularity, unhappiness, and imperfection of every kind. And he said that this liberating power of Truth is his own ministry.

"According to his statement, 'He who gives you an example, that you should do as I have done to you,' Christ Jesus expected us to follow him. This means that it is possible to do so. Jesus marked out the way, and Christian Science shows us how to follow the Way-shower.

An image and likeness, being the perfect reflection of its original, must manifest like quality. Hence man, in his image and likeness of God, perfectly reflects every quality of divine Mind, Spirit, Soul, Principle, Life, Truth, and Love. For instance, as the image perfectly Mind, he reflects infinite intelligence, understanding, wisdom, ability, capability, capacity, and so on. He knows exactly as God knows, and he desires, wishes, and is able to do as God does. His thoughts, or ideas, express His, and he is Godlike. What does not express divine Mind, Spirit, Life, Truth, and Love is not of God and so has no power, no existence, no power, no reality. It has no presence in the divine consciousness which, in our true being, you and I individually reflect—and there is no other real consciousness. The understanding that there is, in reality, no other

in consciousness is the law of annihilation to the claim of error to presence in the human consciousness. And when error's claim is destroyed, its claim to manifestation in his experience ceases. In brief, we remove the distracting effect from individual experience by dealing with and destroying the error. The result is the belief of wrong thinking claiming presence in individual human consciousness.

Even as a human being, man's body, his anatomy, and so forth, vanishes in his experience as a human being. In this so-called material body is a mental concept included in human conduct. This is why the human body may be healed by correction of the error. If this body were something separate and apart from mind, it could not be affected in any way or another by thought. But since one's own body is a mental concept of himself, his thinking about himself, to improve this thinking through spiritualization of thought must necessarily improve his body. Consequently there is no possibility of thought being received without improving the body.

Stock Show Exhibit Strikes at Rural Losses and Wastes

A more permanent and profitable agriculture and a higher level of rural living through the exhibition of Illinois colleges of agriculture will make at the International All-Stock exposition in Chicago, on December 3 to 9.

Arrived in the exhibit will be facts, figures and illustrations showing the surprising degree to which the annual gross income of \$50 to \$50 million dollars which farm families of Illinois has been yielding in recent years is affected by such prodigious as farm and home accidents, sickness in the home soil erosion, insect pestilence of horses and milks, storage grain insects, weeds, inferior seed, and wasteful feeding.

Approved practices for soil improvement and erosion control also are featured in the exhibit as an important means of protecting the farm income. These will include pasture improvement, use of limonite and phosphorus, rotation of crops, better adapted rotations, planting of roots to reduce hard, water-worn terraces and contour farming.

As a means of reducing the heavy toll of farm and farm home accidents, the exhibit stresses constructive planning, use of available safety devices, careful use of live-factory, precautions with insecticides, avoiding disaster, cautious handling of tools and explosives, use of fireproof premises, common sense, adequate equipment for the job, careful handling of all equipment and the wearing of proper clothing.
