Suing Bondsmen for Alleged Shortage in Wheeling Turn Fund

The town of Wheeling filed suit in the Cook county circuit court Friday against Henry Grandt Sr. and Albert Neumann, bondsmen for the late Supervisor Charles Grandt, for \$4000. The complaint alleges that Charles Grandt was grand juror of the township from 1937 until his death in May of this year. He was removed from the post by official action on April 21.

It is claimed that the late supervisor failed to pay over \$178,900 of town funds and over \$100,000 of \$1911.68 alleged due to the town. Mr. Grandt died in May of this year.

Efforts to secure from the bondsmen the amount of money claimed due the town failed. It was heard and suit was instituted.

State Road Number Changes Reported

Numerical changes of state roads in Lake county were announced Saturday by H. T. Gehl, county superintendent of highways. The state highway department has replaced the road markers of U. S. route 46, referred to as Milwaukee avenue, from the junction with major road 54, sometimes called the Ashford road, west of Libertyville. From that junction south the route 46 numbers are now in place of the former route 54 to Half Day.

The former Milwaukee avenue route 21 has replaced 46 from Half Day north through Libertyville and takes up the former 54 up to the state line. Route 54 now starts at Grayslake, joins 59A at Inzaboo and swings south to Cook county along the same route.

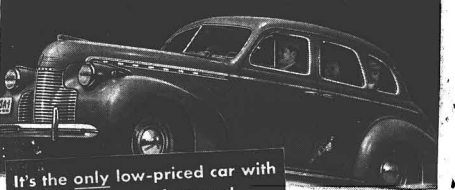
