YOUR FARM COLUMN

Howdy, Farm Friends! Farmers who have been in the corn harvest service have found that crops planted in curved rows are better than those planted in straight rows on Illinois sloping field during 1939, despite the fact that the curved rows are not over 20% above normal as the yield increases may seem, the decreases in soil losses by erosion brought about by the contour rows are still more important.

Better field corn ears were marked with a increase of four to five bushels per acre. No noticeable erosion took place in these field while field corn having similar slopes were marked with a loss of 10 to 15 bushels per acre. The contour rows cut across the line of flow of run-off water and prevent it from cutting down the run-off and causing more of the water to soak to the ground to the benefit of the crop.

Reports indicate no noticeable erosion on wheat farms in the north Illinois during the worst growing season. Measure is one of the most valuable assets of the champion of farmers today.
